Forsythe served as the president of the Association for Computing Machinery (ACM), and also co-authored four books on computer science and a fifth on meteorology, and edited more than 75 other books on George Elmer Forsythe was born 8 January 1917 in State College, Pennsylvania, to Dr. Warren Ellsworth Forsythe, an academic physician and cofounder of the American Student Health Association (ASHA), and DeEtta Brodie Forsythe.
